The situation is intolerable for anyone who lives nearby, particularly, those living directly opposite the sight, who have to suffer ever-increasing amounts of HGVs proceeding in and out every day, all day, from early morning. Doubling of output would, of course, require a doubling of traffic..

The bottom line is, that it should never have been sited there, when there are more suitable sites on the nearby Industrial Estate, but, of course, this site provides them with the availability of cheap/free water from a well. Residents having to suffer so that they can save on their water costs.

The Pickhill Lane /A525 junction, just a few yards from my home, has already been altered to try and accommodate the HGVs tuning out onto the A525, without success. They still have to swing out onto the far side of what is a very busy, twisting, road. Any further expansion of the site would require even more disruption and changes to that junction.

I have to tell you, given their experience with the last appeal/public inquiry, local residents have no confidence that their voices will be heeded in any future appeals.

Anything you can do to stop any further destruction of the local living environment would be appreciated.

## **Further email October 2022**

I can see the slaughterhouse from my window, and live on the A525, on a bend, just a few yards from the junction with Pickhill Lane, and our concerns about the road pre-date the opening of the slaughterhouse. It is a narrow, twisting road, but a major route into Wrexham, and Wrexham Industrial Estate, particularly since the Southern link road was opened.

We have complained for over 30 years about the speed of traffic around these bends, the problem we face every time we pull out of our drive, and the dangers of the narrow pavement along it. The slaughterhouse has simply added to those concerns ten-fold. But still, they allowed the place to be opened and then expanded.
